

Future of Rural Northeast without Natural Gas:


- Population losses

- Agriculture still pre-1978




Fortunately, Shale Gas Is Here & Here to Stay:

- Natural gas extraction has increased dramatically. In 2013, U.S. produced nearly 30.2 trillion cubic feet, up from 23.5 Tcf in 2006.
- The Marcellus Shale, world's 2nd largest natural gas field containing as much as 516 trillion cubic feet.
- Possible from the combination of horizontal drilling (1990's) and hydraulic fracturing (1947).









- Bradford has lowest unemployment

- Lower consumer costs







New York counties lost 13,327 jobs for a 8.6% decline, while the two Pennsylvania counties gained 1,645 jobs for an increase of 5.2%.























