- Need community image / theme / retail identity
- Recreation / arts destination potential
- Need destination gateway
- Organization to fund raise for various needs
- Need activities to engage youth
- Downtown improvements at pedestrian scale
- Renovate fire hall as community / senior center
- Consider moving activities to Front Street
- Add athletic / youth facilities at Fireman's Park
- Develop Visitors Center

# VILLAGE DOWNTOWN ASSESSMENT - 2001

(Continued)

- Pedestrian / bicycle facilities, Front St. to river
- Improve park space behind the Library
- Expand Farmers Market
- Weekly youth market?
- Signage / kiosk for visitors

# TOWN COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AND ACTION PLAN - 2003

- Develop river accesses
- Improve Airport Road
- Water / sewer for Roods Creek, lakes
- New Town / Community Hall & Highway Garage
- Explore intermunicipal projects
- Municipal solid waste program
- Support development of youth center
- Support regional community center
- Bicycle and foot trails
- Explore municipal park / pavilion / picnic area with recreation fields

# TOWN COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AND ACTION PLAN - 2003

(Continued)

- Support waterfront park
- Develop recreation park on NYS 10, Stilesville
- Create fishing access & possible park on river
- Town website
- Tourist signage
- Support historic theater

# VILLAGE SEWER COMMUNITY IMPACT STATEMENT - 2004

- Heavy Village debt limits infrastructure
- Sewer bills are about \$400/year
- Village property taxes up 59%, 2001-2004
- Deteriorating water system
- Very low per capita incomes
- An “adjacent center of employment”
- Village under consent order
- Need 24 units of senior housing
- Potential community development on I-86
